Directions

From the north, west, and south: take the A228 NE from the junction with the A21. After approx 2 km, turn left into Old Church Road (signed to Kent College). From the north-east: follow the A228 and turn right into Old Church Road. Park in Old Church Road (TQ 627425). The road is quite narrow so please park carefully and avoid blocking gateways. Nearest railway stations are High Brooms (5 km) or Tonbridge (6 km).

Courses

60 minute score suitable for all abilities. Visit as many controls as you can. Controls score 1 point each with a penalty for lateness of 1 point per minute/part minute.

Map and Terrain

1:10,000 map with 5m contours, drawn 2004 by Dave Kingdon and John Faller with updates. Maps will be printed on A4 waterproof paper. Terrain is a mixture of random small blocks, predominantly forest of variable runnability either side of the A228.

Registration

Mass start at 19:30 sharp.

Equipment

SPORT IDENT dibbers to hire if you don't have one. Some sort of torch essential plus a small backup/reserve. Whistle advisable.

Cost

£2 per person. Dibber hire £1.

The Camden Arms (www.camdenarms.co.uk) in Pembury (TQ 624406). Food served until 2130. From Old Church Road turn right onto the A228, and then left at the traffic lights towards Pembury village. Pub is about 750 metres on the right, opposite the green.
