Details:

There are two courses: a 7 leg A course and a 5 leg B course. Each course has a number of classifications that a team can compete in.

A course – 7 legs

Open and Handicap and Small Club classes

The Handicap System

The handicap points are calculated based on age group.
Each age class is accorded a points value as follows:

Age class	10	12	14	16	18	20	21	35	40	45	50	55	60	65+
Men	1	2	4	6	8	9	10	9	8	7	6	5	4	3
Women	1	2	3	4	5	6	7	6	5	4	3	2	1	0

The team total is the sum of all runners in the team.

Each relevant class is permitted a maximum points score from the above table as follows:

Class Handicap

A Handicap 49 points or under

B Handicap 26 points or under

B Women's Handicap 26 points or under

Trophies:

A OPEN, Handicap age handicap 49 points or less, Small Club

B Women Premier, Junior (M/W 20 or under), Womens handicap 26 points or less, Handicap 26 points or less

Teams are to register for A or B course. A team can enter for more than one trophy, but they can receive only one trophy in the order of precedence above.

Teams are also welcome from a combination of clubs, but will not be eligible for the main trophies. They will be eligible for an extra "Saxons Harvester trophy" for the next best team (on the B course) that did not win any of the 4 B course trophies.

For teams travelling from outside the UK, please contact the organiser at development@saxons-oc.org for any questions on travel, payment or camping requirements. Eridge is approx 60 minutes from Dover.

For teams wanting to fly in, Eridge is approx 40 mins from London Gatwick airport, and we can organise transport from Gatwick, and any camping tents.
